During the year we welcomed 15 CORE and short-term participants: Sonja Arnold, Dirk Kaiser, Patrizia Kasik, and Susanne Kraus from Germany under the auspices of AGJ, a German non-profit that has partnered with CIP for many years; Gunnel Kronberg, Luka Sydstal, and Catarina Vidmark from Sweden; Kirsi Vuori-Tuompo and Eija Piiparinen from Finland; Dilfuza Rasulova and Alimardon Suyunov from Uzbekistan; Bernard Bananzi from Ghana; Fatima Leyva from Peru; Emmerentiana Nkede from Cameroon; and Shadiya Sbeit from Israel .

The placement sites for our CORE and Short Term participants included Community Refugee & Immigration Services, Franklin County West Central School, Franklin County Administrative Services, The Village Network, Central Community House, Franklin County Board of Development Disabilities, Clintonville Beechwold Community Resource Center, Grandview Heights High School, Union County Court of Common Pleas, and the Marion Correctional Institute.

CIP hosted Mirahan Farag from Egypt as part of a pilot program offered by USAID and the Community Connections program. The goal of this program is to contribute to economic and democratic reform and to promote mutual understanding through personal connections with Americans and participants and exposure to U.S. society. This program was delayed due to the recent events in Egypt, but ultimately was a success.



During the fiscal 2011 year, CIP hosted three delegations including one as part of the Community Connections Program and two as part of the Open World Program. The Community Connections Program delegation consisted of ten professionals from the Luhansk region of Eastern Ukraine and focused on Economic Development.

The other two delegations participated in the Open World Program sponsored by the Library of Congress. The first was a delegation of judges from Ukraine, sponsored in partnership with the Ohio Supreme Court and the Russian American Rule of Law Consortium based in Vermont. The second Open World delegation consisted of staff members of the Kyrgyzstan Parliament, which focused on the rule of law and judicial system of the United States.

CIP hosted 43 participants (up from 41 for 2010) during the fiscal year, including our delegations and the OCLC Fellows.

Since establishing the Schildhouse Founders Fund in fiscal 2010, CIP has awarded a total of seven grants totaling \$3,500 to various organizations including Rwandan Women in Action, the Haiti Empowerment Project, the Horn of Africa Rescue Committee, the United Nations Association, Columbus Sister Cities, the Ohio Supreme Court, and Children Helping Children. We are very excited about the success of the fund and would welcome additional contributions to honor the work of Ruth and Burt Schildhouse as well as the other founders of the Columbus International Program.

CIP awarded a grant of \$500 to the Columbus Sister Cities International to help CSCI fund an international exchange program with Chinese students from Hefei, China.
